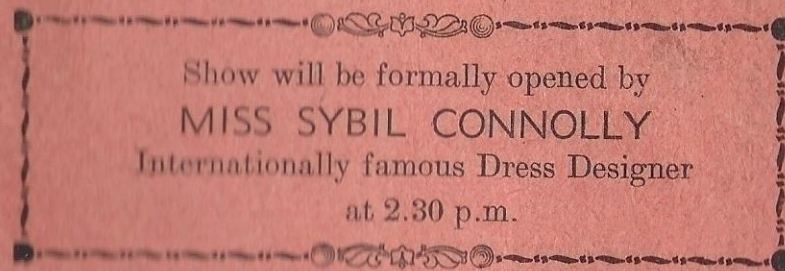

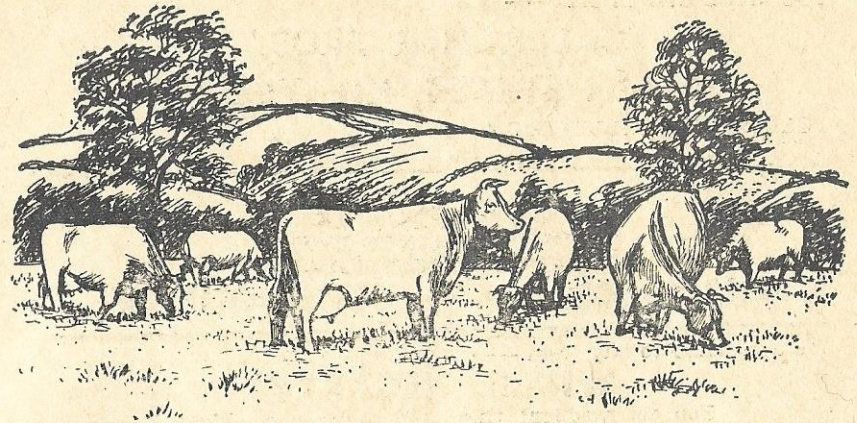

(under the auspices of Muintir na Tire Parish Guild)

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1—Competition is confined to exhibitors from Donegal except where a class or classes is scheduled open.
- 2—Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor for at least two months before date of Shows.
- 3—Exhibits in Farm and Garden Produce, Industrial Section, Arts and Crafts, must have been grown or manufactured, as the case may be, by the exhibitor.
- 4—The Show Committee acting through its officers may refuse an entry without assigning any reason.
- 5—The Show Committee, while cataloguing the exhibits, will not accept liability for any error in the numbering of the exhibit, for any exhibit not being displayed, or for loss of, accident or damage to an exhibit.
- 6—The Judges may withhold a prize in any class in which in their opinion there is not sufficient merit. The Judges' decision as to "merit" shall be final.
- 7—Subject to the Judges' decision, no prize will be awarded in a class unless there are at least two entries. No second prize unless there are at least five entries, and no third prize unless there are ten entries.
- 8—In the case of only one exhibit in a class the Judges may award a "merit" Certificate, if in their opinion, the exhibit warrants it.
- 9—In classes where there are a very large number of entries, the Judges may award "Merit" Certificates if exhibits in their opinion warrant them.
- 10—Entry Fee must be paid when entering, otherwise double fees will be charged. All entries must be received on or before the 11th August, 1956.
- 11—Exhibitors wishing to sell an exhibit must state on Entry Form "For Sale" — Price £ s d.
- 12—Animals for exhibition at Shows must be in Show Grounds at 10 o'clock a.m. on the morning of the Shows.
- 13—All cattle must be haltered and trained to the lead.
- 14—No exhibit will be removed from the Show Grounds without a permit from the Chief Steward whose name will appear in the Show Catalogue.
- 15—The age—where Schedule states same is necessary—must be stated in Entry Form for animals in order that Judges may have the necessary details to arrive at the awards.
- 16—Any statement re age or ownership wrongly and intentionally made in the Entry Form, (in the opinion of the Executive Committee), disqualifies the Exhibitor from receiving a Prize.
- 17—A. Prizes will be presented on the field by the chief steward

immediately after Judges' decision.

B. Prizes in the Industrial and Farm Produce, and Arts and Crafts classes may be claimed from Secretary in the Hall, between the hours of 5 and 6 o'clock on evening of Show.

18—All Perpetual Challenge Cups to be returned in good condition to Secretary not later than one calendar month before date of Show.

19—The Show Committee decline responsibility for any accidents sustained by members of the public in the Show grounds or Hall in connection with the Show.

20—All exhibits in the Industrial Section, Arts and Crafts Sections except those received through the post, to be claimed and collected between the hours of 5 and 6 o'clock p.m. on evening of Show.

21—As judging starts in Halla Muire at 10 o'clock a.m., all exhibits in the Industrial and Farm Produce Sections, butter, eggs, honey, cakes, fruit, jam and flowers must be in the Hall the evening before the Shows between the hours of 6 and 9. In special cases exhibits will be received on morning of Show.
