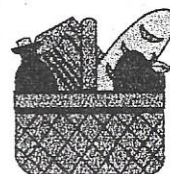

News from the church
Fr. Eddies farewell to J.P. Cunningham. 15-2-98

Today I would like to welcome everyone here to J.P.'s funeral mass and on behalf of the Cunningham family, to thank you all for your presence with us today.

I would also like to thank all the people who prayed for J.P. on Thursday and Friday here in this church and in their own private moments, also, to thank all the people who gave J.P. medical and spiritual help on the site where he became ill and later in Portiuncula hospital. The Cunningham family are very grateful to you all.

Today we are a broken and lonely community. We are mourning once the death of a teenager. "Is le croi trom a thagamis le chéile inniú chun corp J.P. leagadh I g Cré na cille.

J.P. became ill on Wednesday morning last. It was the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and it was also "World day of the sick". I am sure that our Lady of Lourdes took good care of J.P. and that he is with her in heaven today. I am happy that I was able to spend a few hours with J.P. and with the family in Portiuncula hospital in Balinasloe before his death on Thursday. We prayed with him and imparted the Sacraments to him as he approached death.

"Happy you who weep now: you shall laugh."

"Is méanar daoibhse atá ag gol anois, óir déanfaidh sibh gáire".

Today is a sad sad day here in Carrick. Our hearts go out to Connie and Angela, Michael, Dessie, Conal, Hugh and Sean and also his aunts and uncles and cousins. They are lonely and broken hearted.

We are here to console and to support them and I am sure that J.P. will be in Heaven to intercede for them and to welcome them home to heaven some day.

"Ar lá níos faide anon, ná an lá inniu"

"When you bury someone you love you bury part of yourself".

In the coming weeks, months and years the grief will not end but it will fade and soften. J.P.'s grave will be a place of prayer and pilgrimage for the family in the coming years.

Today we thank God for J.P. and for the years of life that were given to him. Like Jesus himself, he died a young man. God was good to J.P. he had a good home and a good family. Angela and Connie have been a dedicated and wonderful parents. J.P. enjoyed his game of football and made many friends, having played for Naomh Columba, The Donegal Voc. team and the Donegal minor team. He had the honour of wearing the county jersey. He will be remembered and recorded as one of those who played for Donegal minors last year in Ballybofey last year against Antrim. Through the help of Pat Curran J.P. began his plumbing apprenticeship in Athlone two weeks ago. he was just beginning his career.

In recent years quite a number of young people / teenagers died in this area. Since I came back here, almost five years ago, quite a few young people have died in our locality. I'm thinking today of people like Patrick Cunningham Gannev; Patrick Cunningham Malinmore ;

Edith ward here in Carrick; Paul Cannon in Crove and Louis Mc Ivor Kilcar we are all remembering them all here today.

The death of J.P. and the death of Patrick Cunningham, Malinmore have been a severe blow to Naomh Columba. I am sure that when J. P. and Patrick Danny meet in Heaven, that they will have along dicussion on football matters.

I would like first of all on behalf of the G.A.A. to express our heartfelt sympathy to Connie and Angela, Michael, Dessie, Conal, Hughie and Shaun, uncles, aunts, cousins and friends on the sudden and tragic death of J.P. We know how devastating a blow this is to you all. Our prayers and thoughts are with you now and in the future. It is a huge loss of a future star not alone in our own club but also at County level. So we are all joined in this service today to pay our last respects to J.P. before he is laid to rest.

Rarely does it happen

that a person of such tender years would have created such an impact in a community as was evident from the level of grief witnessed in this area over the last few days. It speaks volumes for him. He may only have been nineteen years of age but he packed an awful lot into those few years. He was a bay of many likeable qualities that endeared himself to all those who went to school with him. They became his friends immediately and we know they will always cherish the memory of that friendship.

He was a very likeable lad who won a legion of friends without any effort on his part - it just came naturally to him. Maybe not unique but a rarity at the same time that four brothers would feature on a club senior team together- yes- last year in the league against Naomh Cumhalls - Desie, Conal, J.P. and Hughie lined out together and gave their best for our club as they always did.

The football was never far away from J.P. at any time if he had minutes to spare - how often would you see him dribble or solo the ball as he went up the town on messages. Little wonder he progressed to feature at county level for the vocational schools team and for the county minor team and gave real J.P. performances of heart and soul in those competitions. Yes he was the key figure in many of our under age club games and these are fondly remembered. He wore his attire with pride always and how fitting he is being laid to rest now wearing our clubs attire.

J.P. has gone now to join a number of his former playing colleagues who were snatched from this life long before their prime. Only in the last two years alone Paddy Cunningham of Gannev and Patrick Cunningham of Mailnmore. Very recently Con Shean of Teelin who also wore our Club jersey with pride. Let us remember those also in our prayers. J.P. would have been present when tributes were expressed on the occasions of their bereavements. We can only imagine, if we really believe in the next life what a welcome they now have for J.P. today. There will be some goals scored, some matches won and I'm quite sure they will be keeping a close eye on our clubs performance in the future as we strive to pick up the pieces from yet another tragic blow to our limited resources.

To the Cunningham family we say thank you for your immeasurable support to our club and for giving us so many superb players. We can assure you that our club will always strive to uphold that great tradition in which your family were and are an inspiration to the youth of today. The turnout for the homecoming of J.P.'s remains and today's service in which our club Naomh Columba, Carrick Vocational and National School and the wider community were joined by the management and workers of Errigal Eisc Teo where J.P. also worked for some time is a clear indication to the Cunningham family that we all share the great loss of such a jewel from our midst. God in all his glory has gained what we have lost.

Our wish is just a simple prayer - God bless J.P. and keep him in his care. To finish I have been given a few lovely lines by friends of J.P.'s who wished to express their feelings and they show the regard in which he was held.

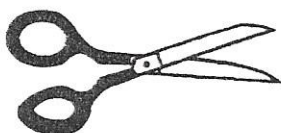

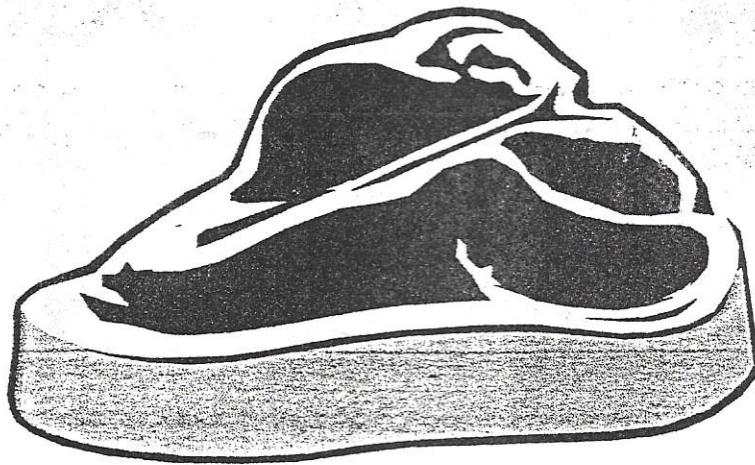
