KILCAR IN DAYS GONE BY - extract from "The Cliff Scenery of South-West Donegal" by Thomas Colin Mc Ginley.(mid 1800's)

Passing down a deep descent, we reach the village of Kilcar, nestling in a gorge at the meeting of two deep glens and where two brawling torrents unite in their hurried passage to the sea. The village of Kilcar consists of two rows of houses lining a wide, steep street. The situation is an exceedingly romantic one, surrounded as it is with an amphitheatre of steep craggy hills. The Catholic Chapel stands at the upper end of the town - that nearest to Killybegs - and is remarkable for its extreme neatness and the taste displayed in its internal arrangements. The parochial house is on the same side of the street just outside the chapel gate. It is the hospitable abode, of the Rev. Hugh O' Donnell, P.P., whose singularly successful exertions in diffusing the blessings of a sound practical education throughout his extensive parish are so well known, and so highly appreciated.

The Protestant Church is at the lower end of the town, near where the rivers of the two glens meet. The rector, Rev. E. Labatt, resides at a place called Roxboro on the eastern shore of Teelin Bay, about two miles from town. On the steep hill above and opposite the church, may be observed the remains of an old ecclesiastical structure called Cill Charthadh whence the town gets the name of kilcar. The place was, till lately, used as a burying-ground.

Kilcar is Six miles from Killybegs, has eight fairs in the year but no weekly market. It has a district dispensary and post-office. There is only one school (the Keenaghan) which is in connexion with the national board, and is largely attended. There is no petty sessions court, the business requiring such an institution being transacted at Killybegs.

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


LOST AND FOUND
