The scheme is still in progress, and is being dealt with by the FARM DEVELOPMENT SERVICE at Donegal 48.

Saeltach grassland plots were distributed in the Kilcar and and Glencolmcillo erass. This may be the last year of the scheme, but hopes are that fertiliser will be subsidized in the new Western Package (300 million pounds).

The wet weather in July caused big hey losses in other parts of the country. This prompted the government to introduce a scheme to push growing late grees.

A £28 subsidy was given for a ton of Mitr gen, and £3 a ton was given to first time silege makers. Some farmers in the area availed of these grants.

Lemb spices in early autumn were poor, but the Co-op in Bogagh main sined a price of 25p per pound. They sold 2500 lembs

to lowland fattners, and reports back from these fermers are that the lambs are doing well. The Co-op hopes to sell in the region of 4000 lambs next year.

Cattle prices were also poor early on, but due to the shortage of beef in the factories and the fall-off in cownumbers, prices for cattle are now well improved, and should remain so for the coming months.







MINING ON SLIABH LIAG?

Some months ago certain areas in Co. Donegal were advertised by the Department of Energy for licensing by companies interested in mineral prospecting and mining. Licences for most of these areas have been acquired but two of them - nos. 2991 and 2992 have not yet been taken up, roughly a strip from Towney to Malinmore.

A Co. Donegal member of An Taisce wrote to the Donegal Planning Committee reminding them that they themselves had already designated the Sliabh Liag area in particular as areas of special scientific interest and international importance and should by that definition not have been open to licensing at all.

The planning committee responded by lodging an objection with the Minister for Energy on these grounds:

- (1) Sliabh Liag has rare Alpine and Arctic Flowers which could be irreparably damaged if disturbed by prospecting or mining.
- (2) The northwestern end of the mountain contains one of the very few natural uncontaminated boglands in Europe and even the drilling of one hole could destroy its significance.
- (3) The entire mountain is important as an area of study for geological history.

This objection postponed the granting of the licences, pending further information. Bord na Mona, who had originally designated the boglands and the Department of Lands and Fisheries have been approached to add their voices to the case but so far it is unclear how the minister will rule.

Bearing in mind that if the Minister had properly informed himself about special areas like these and respected the judgment of local government planning, in which case a disput would never have arisen, there are other arguments against the intrusion of mining and prospecting companies in these areas.

There is a real danger of lead poisoning getting into domestic and animal water supplies in the event of a lead find. While mining companies promise to find new water supplies in such an event, they don't claim to be able to clean up contaminated ones - and so far our birds, fish, sheep and cattle can't read danger signs.

Apart from the pleasure we who live here derive from some of the most beautiful scenery in Ireland, many tourists come to enjoy it with us, forming an important contribution to our local economy. If the scientific interest were to be destroyed and the physical beauty endangered, the long term loss of extra revenue from visitors might easily offset any short-term gain from mining, - once the mining companies lose interest in us we could be left without minerals, natural gifts and tourists.

Last, but not least we owe our children the uncontaminated heritage which, after all, we only have on loan ourselves.

BALLYMOON VISIT

One of the Biggest disappointments of the past year was the closure in August of Ballymoon factory which left many local people out of work. Many rumours have circulated about the future of the fine factory building up the Glen and the events of last week will add further fuel to the recent talk of another business starting up there. Under the auspices of Udaras na Gaeltachta two helicopters landed at the factory last week carrying a group of American businessmen who are engaged in a feasibility study to set up a company in the country. The nature of the American buisness has not been disclosed but hopes are that the buses carrying workers will be back on the road again up the Glen.

GLENBAY FUTURE

As we go to press another meeting of creditors of the Glenbay is being held which may indicate the future for the hotel at Malimmore. The hotel which is jointly owned by a local group headed by Fr. Mc Dyer and Udaras na Gaeltachta closed in November with grave financial difficulties the debts amounted to more than £300,000. The closure of the hotel saddened many people. Therefore hill sheep farmers will get only a fraction of what they were led to expect by the Minister.

This has been the latest of a number of setbacks to the industry. Sheep farmers are getting increasingly disillusioned by the lack of official interest in their problems. It is to be hoped that things do not get worse.




