THE ISLAND

Have you ever heard of an Island that is not surrounded by water. Well in Bogagh there is a level piece of land of about four acres situated on the left bank of the Glen river bordering the mid Bogagh farms and this has always been known as the 'Island'. Although the Island is on the Bogagh side of the river it is the property of the Carrick and Upper Carrick folk who live on the far side of the river.

In olden times the Glen river at this point instead of taking a straight course swung around in a semicircle. A trench was dug by local men and with the assistance of the flood water the river changed course and flowed in a straight line. The outline of the old river bed may be seen to the present day. The purpose of the exercise was to alleviate flooding of the holmes adjacent to the river at this point.

But up until the present day the Island becomes completely submerged during heavy flooding and when the water recedes a large lake is left behind around the old river bed.

Salmon were often stranded in the long hay which grew in the lake during the harvest. There is record of a young Bogagh girl, Bridget Byrne, being knocked down by a large eighteen pound Salmon lurking in the hay.

Young boys and girls often paddled in their bare feet in the luke warm water.

The Carrick folk carried the hay in 'Crossogs' on their backs across to the far side of the river where they built it into haycocks.

Adjacent to the Island is Loggy Hip (Lug Na N-Iopach), the pool of the mud. This is a dark river pool famous for its Salmon and Trout fishing. Huge amounts of Salmon and sea Trout were netted there in by gone days by Poachers and every townland had a few poaching 'crews' in the twenties, thirties and forties.

Young John Byrne of Bogagh, when passing by Loggy Hip on his way to mass on a sunny morning was surprised to see hundreds of Salmon shading from the morning sun near the entry of a little stream on the left bank. The Salmon were so numerous that their heads were above water as they rested on each others backs. Mick Byrne a neighbour, came on the scene and he threw a large stone into the middle of the shoal of Salmon killing one large fish.

This traitorous dark pool claimed the lives of two young men in living memory in the thirties and early forties.

It's a funny old world

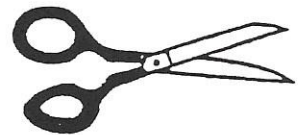

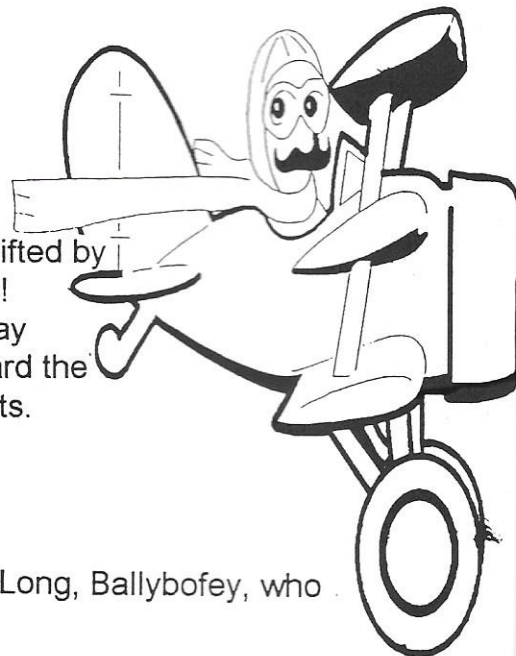

Darts Bounce!!

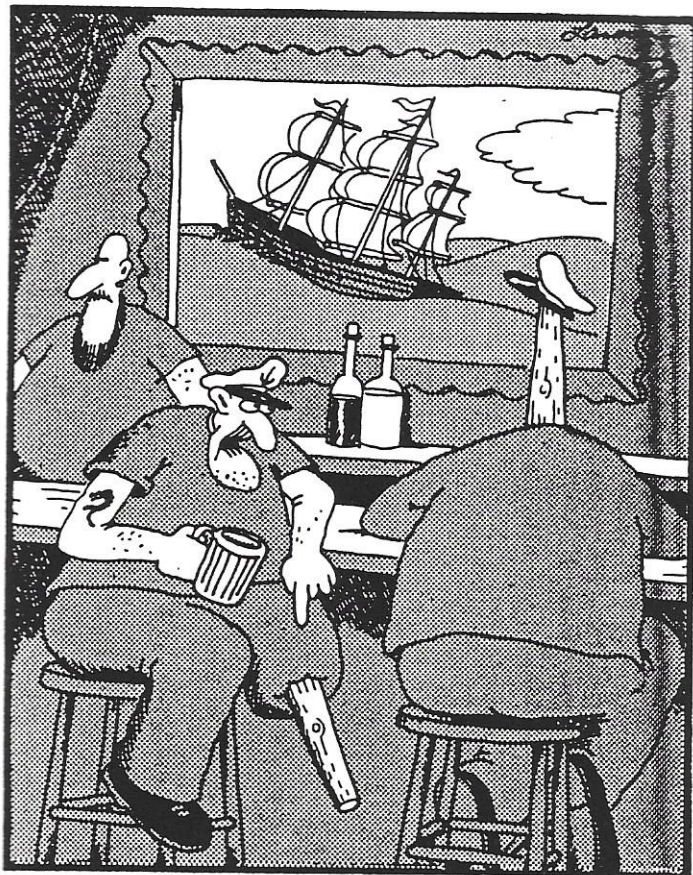

The man arrested in Carrick was taken to Ballyshannon and having gone through the court there was handed over to the R.U.C. He arrived in Carrick on Wednesday night with a group of hostellers who had picked him up on the road from Donegal.

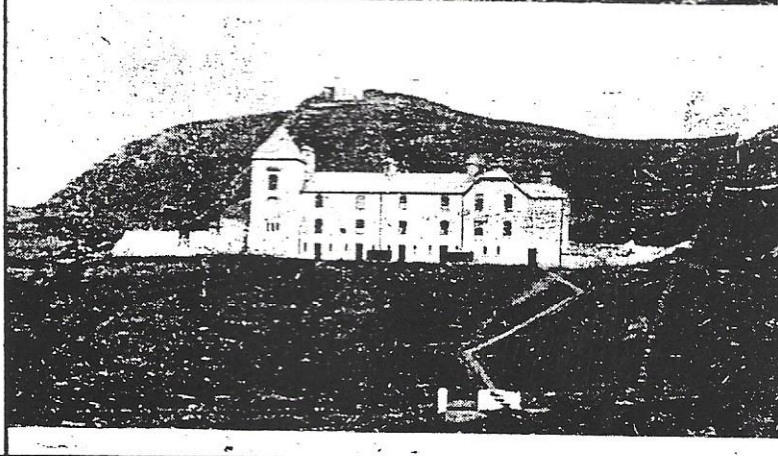
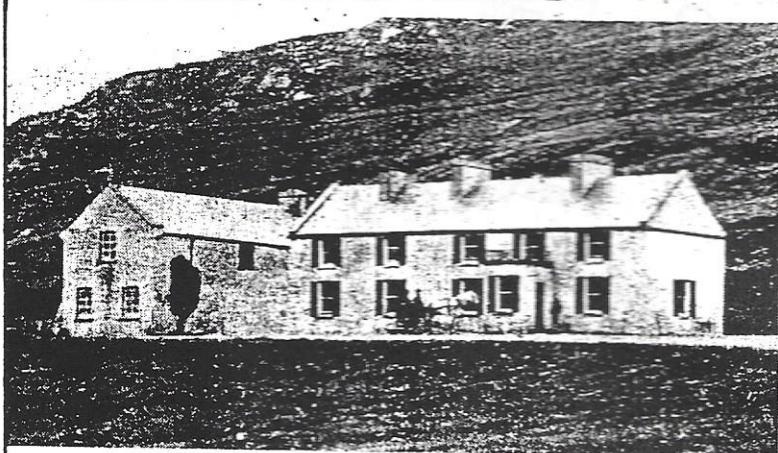
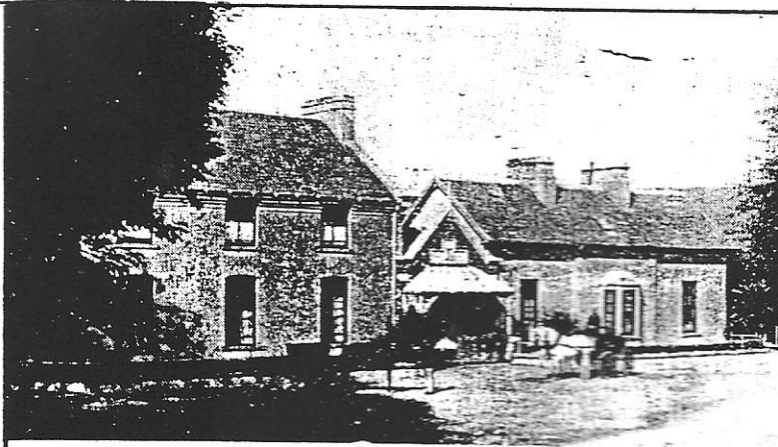
Burning of properties in the early twenties

Information fell into the hands of local Republican Intelligence in 1920 which indicated that British Black and Tan forces were about to occupy some large buildings in the Carrick Area from which they would police the area.

The I.R.A. forces burned both the barracks and the Glencolumbkille Hotel.

A similar happening occurred in April of 1923 when Republican forces burned both the Lodge situated at the Musgrave Estate, Clogher and the Coastguard Station at Teelin Pier. This operation was to prevent free State Troops from coming to billet in the area.

However the troops did come afterwards and they occupied "Nelsons" house on the Musgrave Estate.

On one particular Sunday when Meenacross were playing Carrick, Phil Browne was unable to be present at Straleel where the game was being played. He lived at the end of the village on the Straleel approach road.

He was on the road impatiently awaiting the first cyclist coming from the game to see how his local heroes did.

Now there was always a race between the lads, who had bicycles, to see who would be the first to reach the Carrick village a distance of two miles.

A lad shot around the turn in the road, the first bicycle. "Who won?" Phil shouts at him. "A draw, a draw", was the quick reply. "What score?" The lad had by now passed Phil but he looked over his shoulder and shouted back "Two two, to two two, too". Phil scratched his head but he got the message.
