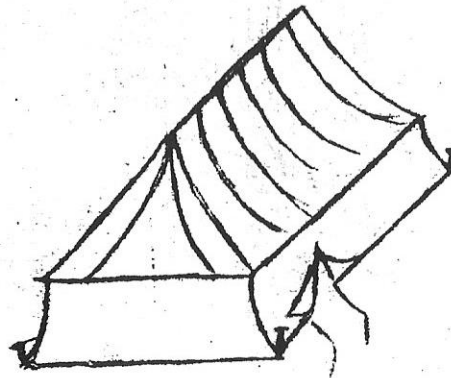

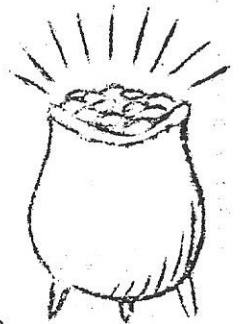

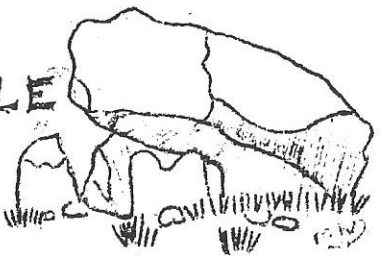
ÓR SA GARBOG

"MAGIC"

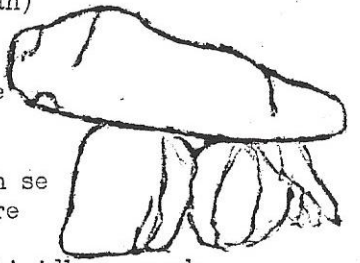
MARGO THE MAGICIAN visited Carrick National School this week.

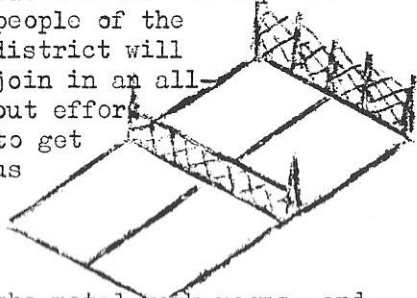
